


### **Child Care Subsidy**

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# Our Preschool Programme Past Month in Review

Sweetpeas Since the children have embraced our music groups with enthusiasm, we have been lucky to have some Mums come in to share their music talents with us. Eliza's mum Sally came in to play some special songs from favourite movies on the flute, 'Let it Go', 'You're Welcome' and 'How Far I'll Go', which the children really loved. She spoke about how she cleans her flute and how to put it together in order to take good care of it. Last week we had a music class with Gabe's mum Carmel. We explored and experimented with sound and rhythm. She had many props and new songs to teach us. The children had fun playing drums, shakers and dancing with scarves and tissues as well as pretending to skate on paper plates. She had so many good ideas to share with us to make our music groups a lot of fun. The children engage with these music times and enjoy experimenting with different percussion instruments, learning to keep beat to different music tempos as well as learning to work together so that everyone is heard. We will continue to explore these instruments encouraging self- expression.

**Bluebells:** We can't believe we are into Term 3 already! We hope you are enjoying looking through your child's portfolio and seeing all the amazing work they have done this year so far. We have just had a very exciting holiday program with lots of great activities happening each day. The children particularly enjoyed an exciting Science day. We started the day off with some salt painting. The children were invited to create a picture with glue – dribbling it all over the paper. Once they were happy with it, they then covered the glue in salt and shook off the excess. Then came the science part! Using some water colour paint and a dropper, we dripped some paint onto the salty glue and – WOW! The paint spread through the salt and the glue all by itself! This was fantastic to watch and the children were very keen to add more colours to the salty glue and watch it move. "It's like a snake!" Oliver H said! We also watched an experiment using Mentos lollies and a bottle of Coke –that was like a volcano! The children also showed a lot of interest in magnets that day and spent a bit of time experimenting with different ones we have at preschool and finding out what they would stick to. Science day was a lot of fun!

Schoolies: What a fulfilled past few weeks I have had during the short time that I have been here so far. All the Schoolies have made me (Cat) feel very welcome at Mt Colah Preschool. Many of the children have expressed a willingness to support and assist me as I learn the day- to- day routine and practice at Mount Colah Preschool, as well as also helping me learn the names of their fellow peers that attend. Over the past few weeks the holiday program has provided both the Schoolies and myself an opportunity to get to know one another, beginning to form relationships whilst engaging in a wide variety of different experiences together. The Schoolies have discovered that they have the capacity to cope with change and approach a new situation with confidence. An experience such as this also offers opportunity for all children to negotiate changes in their status or identities, especially when they will be attending full-time school and make transition to a new setting next year. Georgia, Sophia and Penny were all sitting together playing. They made a zoo and all the animals were talking to each other.


Georgia said "All these animals are best friends aren't they?" and Penny replied "Yes, they are best friends. Just like we are".

Sally (Eliza's Mum) taught the children some information about her flute. She then went on to play some of our favourite songs for the children to sing along to.







# **Phonics Programme**

The children were very excited to meet the cute Peter Puppy that makes a special 'P' sound. Peter Puppy loves Playing in the Park with his Pals and enjoys Paddling around in Puddles. The teachers have

noticed the children's emerging interest in 'Paper aeroplanes' so we had a Paper aeroplane making class. The children all sat in a circle, they listened to the step by step instructions given by the educators then used their receptive language skills and acted upon these instructions. They used their fine motor skills as they folded and pressed the paper in various ways whilst providing support and encouragement to their friends next to them if they were having some difficulties, which was lovely to see. As the children threw their Paper aeroplanes they made the special 'P' sound. We then extended their knowledge by researching Planes at group time.



During the Holiday
Programme we have been
doing revision. We revisited
our favourite Letterland
characters: Lucy Lamp Light,

Oscar Orange, Talking Tess, Clever Cat, Sammy Snake and Dippy Duck. Repetition helps to improve speed in recognition, increases confidence, and strengthens the connections in the brain that help children learn. It was amazing to see the knowledge the children retained on the sounds they learnt weeks ago. Parents, feel free to do sound revision with your children at home to further your child's phonemic awareness.













Working with the children as the year has progressed it is great to see how they now all participate together to create, solve problems and contribute to our group outcomes!!!





Our finished Belonging Tree now hangs at preschool with photos attached to show how our preschoolers work and play together as part of our preschool community.







During the second week of the school holidays we again learnt lots about how much you can achieve with team work. Our slime was fun to make and play with (using wooden spoons not our hands), but was not as successful as we had hoped. We discussed how science experiments don't always work and that by changing the balance of ingredients we will hopefully make better slime next time we attempt it.







On Construction Day the children really impressed in the way they worked with each other to share their ideas and creativity!







Construction Day was a huge success and our finished 'building' had many features in it that the children created together. It was fantastic to see them discussing what they could use items for and how together they managed to construct it.







As we look to our Quality Improvement Plan, our first area of focus is the cultural
