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# Our Preschool Programme Past Month in Review

**Sweetpeas** It is good to see everyone back from their holidays and ready for the new term. We have had an interesting time with the holiday program keeping the children busy and engaged, doing special activities that were organised. With a lot of enthusiasm and concentration the Sweetpeas have continued practicing cutting skills with wonderful results and satisfaction. The children are also enjoying music group especially with Nick visiting with his guitar from time to time. It is lovely to watch how otherwise quiet children get involved expressing themselves through singing and doing actions to music and songs. They aren't self-conscious about their ability and most are eager to let their voices roar. They like songs that repeat words and melodies, use rhythms with a definite beat, and ask them to do things. Singing and music play an important role in many aspects of our lives. Exposing children to music stimulates all areas of a child's development, social and emotional, motor and language skills, as well as helping the body and mind work together. Most importantly music is enjoyable and beautiful and provides us with joy.

Bluebells: The Bluebells have had another wonderful, busy month. This month we have been talking about road safety, in particular being safe in the car and crossing the road. We have talked about the car seats that we need to be in and the importance of wearing a seatbelt. The children enjoyed some role play using seat belts from our road safety kit and we made cars for adventures to the beach, the shops and holidays! It was fantastic to hear the children talking about how they need to "Click Clack Front and Back". Being safe in our car park is of huge importance to us and we have spent a lot of time talking as a group about how we need to take care in the car park. The children are aware of what they need to do – Saige told us we need to hold Daddy's hand in the car park, Harry S said we need to stay beside our parent and Luca told us we can't play in the car park. However, we need mums and dads to remember this too so please hold your child's hand in the car park and keep them safe beside you. We have been practising crossing the road using the STOP LOOK LISTEN THINK system and this is something you can practice with your child while out walking.

**Schoolies:** During May we hosted our annual Walkathon where we raise money for the children at Hornsby Hospital by walking around our outdoor environment. Our Walkathon led educators and the children to explore other areas of fundraising. We looked into various fundraising and charity organisations such as; the Smith Family, the Red Cross, the Salvation Army and the charity bins. We discussed how these organisations help those who need it. The Schoolies were engaged during the conversations and identified ways in which they can and have helped others. Natalie proudly said "My Dad gave his old work shirts away". Alex F said "My Mum gave away old pillows". Thomas suggested "We can give our shoes away". We continued discussing these ideas and suggestions for some time. It was lovely to see and hear the children's passion for helping others.






# Policy Review

# Phonics Programme

The Schoolies are really enjoying their time visiting Letterland and the characters they meet there.

This week we introduced Harry Hatman and the Schoolies practised whispering his special sound by placing their Hand over their mouth so they could feel the Hot breath on their hands. After this the Schoolies were encouraged to draw their own Hopscotch on the pavers. The Schoolies collaborated with one another as they planned and drew their Hopscotch to perfection. Some of the Schoolies went one step further and decided to write numbers in each box. Each of the Schoolies spent a considerable amount of time drawing their Hopscotch, some being Huge and some being small. Once everyone was finished they invited their friends to look and have a turn Hopping through each other's Hopscotch. The Schoolies thoroughly enjoyed this activity; however, the educators noticed a few of the Schoolies were experiencing difficulties when Hopping. Families it would be wonderful if you could do some Hopping activities at home to further your child's gross motor skills. For Show and Tell Charlotte brought in Hungry Hippo's which the Schoolies had a great time playing during Letterland.







The children were very excited to meet Munching Mike, who has a really catchy song that the children are singing at various times of the day at Preschool. This month we have done group activities as well as some individual craft work. When the children work on their own it gives me time to have a good chat with them and they are always happy to talk to me about themselves and things going on in their lives, as well as sharing information related to what we are working on.
