Schoolies:

Wow, what a year it's been watching each and every one of you accomplish so much in just 12 months. Where'd all the time go? Over the past month, we have been supporting the children's school readiness skills through encouraging separation from loved ones at the gate to develop self-help skills as well as encouraging the children to open their own food packaging, put on their shoes independently and take off jumpers. We have been doing timed lunches of 20 minutes to encourage faster eating to ensure they get the most out of play time and physical activity at big school. Families, there are many things you can be doing at home to continue supporting your child with this new and big transition, some of which include practising the walk to big school or catching a bus (whatever your child will be doing next year), organise play dates using our parent contacts sheet provided by the educators (on parent information table), read through your child's developmental portfolio and follow any suggested activities or interests of your child's and regularly encourage self help skills through their daily routine, e.g. getting dressed independently, making their bed, brushing teeth, assisting with making lunches etc.

Now to wrap up the year of our 2024 Schoolies. We have witnessed many special talents and gifts, been taught so many new things and have experienced so much developmental growth from all children. Some of the Schoolies strongest interests this year has consisted of Lego, beyblades, imaginative games on the bark, dress-ups, going on bug hunts, treasure hunts, gumnut collecting in the yard, board games, drawing and more drawing! 




Kindifarm

All of these activities were done by the preschoolers individually and they all had high engagement as they worked. Fine motor skills were used by the children - including cutting, colouring, applying glue and sticky tape and placement of pieces when making their crafts showing how far they have come since we started this year. They used problem solving skills when an issue came up, and persisted in their work without giving up, experiencing the satisfaction of achievement when they completed the activity.



Phonemic Awareness Programme






As we explored the /g/ sound with Golden Girl, the children had the opportunity to spray their hair either green or gold, becoming a Golden or Green Girl/Guy! The children also enjoyed engaging with the activity sheets, further developing their pencil manipulation while writing both the uppercase G and lowercase g.

As we explored the /b/ sound with Bouncy Ben, we focused on the difference between uppercase and lowercase letters. The children were excited to discover all the B names at Preschool that require an uppercase/capital B. We then moved on to lowercase /b/ words, with the children broadening their vocabulary as we discovered the meaning behind new /b/ words.




Uppy Umbrella

To wrap up Letterland for the year, we finished with the /u/ sound. We went on an adventure u u u underground and discovered dinosaur bones, tunnels and cicadas! The children requested to learn about both the long and short /u/ sound, meeting Mr U who is in words like unicorn and uniform where as Uppy Umbrella makes the short /u/ sound like in under and up.

Skipping

Our final skill for the year was skipping and the children have all made great progress towards this very tricky skill. Practicing for this skill has included, 'long distance' skipping races, 'skipping tip' and lots of Mario jumps (to practice alternating our legs and arms). Children are not expected to have mastered this skill until around age six, however by practicing now, they are building the foundations needed to achieve this skill when they are developmentally ready.

Revision

As the year comes to a close, the children have been revising all skills learnt throughout 2024 and it has been amazing to see the progress they have all made, with many of them mastering skills they had been working towards earlier in the year. We would like to say a big congratulations to our Sweetpeas and Bluebells for all they have achieved through our Mini Moves program and for the consistent hard effort they put into all activities this year! We hope our Sweetpeas and Bluebells who are moving up to the Schoolies group enjoy Letterland next year and we look forward to seeing some of our Sweetpeas take on another year of Mini Moves in 2025.

Culture of the Month

This past month we have learnt more about the Turkish culture.

The children have explored this through language, dance, and cooking in which we made some yummy gozleme. Eda taught us how to count and we also learnt a new game called 'Korebe' which we play in our afternoon group times.







CHEATS GOZLEME



Ingredients

- · 1 piece of lebanese bread
- · 1 tblspn butter
- 2 cups of baby spinach
- pepper to taste
- 1/4 cup crumbled feta cheese
- 1/2 cup grated tasty cheese
- Olive oil

Method

- Using a sharp knife, slide the tip of the knife into the edge of the lebanese bread.
- Gently slide the knife to cut the bread at the seam
- When there is a big enough opening for your hand, slide your hand in the middle and gently prise open the bread right to all edges
- Now use the knife to slice all the edges of the bread
- Lay the bread open so it's two flat pieces
- 6. Add the butter to a frying pan and over medium heat, melt the butter
- Add the baby spinach and some pepper
- 8. Stir until the spinach just starts to wilt, then remove from heat
- Using tongs, place the spinach all around one side of the bread
- 10. Sprinkle the feta over the spinach
- 11. Sprinkle the grated cheese over the spinach
- 12. Fold the other side of the bread over the top of the filling
- 13. Using the same frying pan (no need to wash), heat it over high heat
- 14. Add a splash of olive oil around the pan
- 15. Gently pick up the bread and place it into the pan
- 16. Cook for about 2 minutes. Whilst this side is cooking, add a splash of olive oil to the top of the bread. Use a pastry brush to spread the oil all around the bread
- Use an egg slide to flip the bread over, and cook for another 1-2 minutes until it's browning
- 18. Remove from heat. Use either scissors or a pizza cutter to cut the gozleme into pieces
- 19. Sprinkle with lemon juice or serve with lemon wedges.
